This statement is to be read in conjunction with the accompanying notes.

Basis of preparation

The budget has been prepared in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards (as they apply to local government and not-for-profit entities), Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, the *Local Government Act 1995* and accompanying regulations. Material accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this budget are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

Except for cash flow and rate setting information, the budget has also been prepared on the accrual basis and is based on historical costs and modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and liabilities.

The local government reporting entity

All funds through which the City of Bayswater controls resources to carry on its functions have been included in the financial statements forming part of this budget.

In the process of reporting on the local government as a single unit, all transactions and balances between those Funds (for example, loans and transfers between Funds) have been eliminated.

All monies held in the Trust Fund are excluded from the financial statements. A separate statement of those monies appears at Note 14 to the budget.

Critical accounting estimates

The preparation of a budget in conformity with Australian Accounting Standards requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses.

The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Rounding off figures

All figures shown in this statement are rounded to the nearest dollar.

2017-18 Actual balances

Balances shown in this budget as 2017-18 Actual are as forecast at the time of budget preparation and are subject to final adjustments.

Significant changes in accounting policy

Effective 1 July 2018, the City will implement a new organisational structure reducing from four directorates to three. A review of the Program and Nature or Type classifications has been undertaken for the 2018-19 accounts.

The 2017-18 actual and budget comparative figures have been amended to reflect management's classification of Program and Nature or Type.

The significant changes are:

Program

Housing now includes income and expenses relating to Aged Person's Homes. Aged Person's Homes was previously classified under Education and Welfare. The Federal Government decision to fund services through the National Disability Insurance Scheme has resulted in these services being provided by specialist private organisations. The City's Home and Community Care Services (HACC) are no longer being funded by the Federal Government. This arrangement has provided our previous HACC clients with services tailored to meet their needs.

Nature and type

Other Revenue now includes the proceeds from the Aged Person's Homes which was previously classified as Grants, Subsidies and Contributions;

Employee Costs now includes items such as FBT and training which was previously classified as Material and Contracts:

Material and Contracts now includes telephone expenses which was previously classified as Utilities;

Insurance Expenses now includes insurance for plant and equipment which was previously classified as Materials and Contracts;

Other Expenses now includes members' expenses and subsidies for Aged Persons' Homes. These expenses were previously classified as Materials and Contracts.

Budget comparative figures

Unless otherwise stated, the budget comparative figures shown in the budget relate to the original budget estimate for the relevant item of disclosure.

Revenue recognition

Rates, grants, donations and other contributions are recognised as revenues when the

City of Bayswater obtains control over the assets comprising the contributions.

Control over assets acquired from rates is obtained at the commencement of the rating period or, where earlier, upon receipt of the rates.

Basis of preparation (continue)

Key terms and definitions - nature or type

Revenue

Rates

All rates levied under the *Local Government Act* 1995. Includes general, differential, specific area rates, minimum rates, interim rates, back rates, ex-gratia rates, less discounts offered. Excludes administration fees, interest on instalments, interest on arrears and service charges.

Profit on asset disposals

Profit on the disposal of assets including gains on the disposal of long-term investments. Losses are disclosed under the expenditure classifications.

Operating grants, subsidies and contributions

Refer to all amounts received as grants, subsidies and contributions that are not non-operating grants.

Non-operating grants, subsidies and contributions

Amounts received specifically for the acquisition, construction of new or the upgrading of non-current assets paid to a local government, irrespective of whether these amounts are received as capital grants, subsidies, contributions or donations.

Fees and charges

Revenues (other than service charges) from the use of facilities and charges made for local government services, rentals, hire charges, fee for service, photocopying charges, licences, sale of goods or information, fines, penalties, rubbish collection fees, administration fees and other fees and charges.

Interest earnings

Interest and other items of a similar nature received from bank and investment accounts, interest on rate instalments, interest on rate arrears and interest on debtors.

Other revenue

Other revenue, which cannot be classified under the above headings, includes dividends, discounts, rebates etc.

Expenses

Employee costs

All costs associated with the employment of person such as salaries, wages, allowances, benefits such as vehicle and housing, superannuation, employment expenses, removal expenses, relocation expenses, worker's compensation insurance, training costs, conferences, safety expenses, medical examinations, fringe benefit tax, etc.

Key terms and definitions - nature or type (continue)

Expenses (continued)

Materials and contracts

All expenditures on materials, supplies and contracts not classified under other headings. These include supply of goods and materials, legal expenses, consultancy, maintenance agreements, communication expenses, advertising expenses, membership, periodicals, publications, information technology, hire expenses, rental, leases, postage and freight etc.

Utility charges

Expenditures made to the respective agencies for the provision of power, gas or water. Exclude expenditures incurred for the reinstatement of roadwork on behalf of these agencies.

Insurance expenses

All insurance other than worker's compensation and health benefit insurance included as a cost of employment.

Loss on asset disposals

Loss on the disposal of fixed assets includes loss on disposal of long-term investments.

Depreciation on non-current assets

Depreciation expense raised on all classes of assets.

Interest expenses

Interest and other costs of finance paid, including costs of finance for loan debentures, overdraft accommodation and refinancing expenses.

Other expenditure

Statutory fees, taxes, provision for bad debts, members' fees or State taxes. Donations and subsidies made to community groups.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows.

Key terms and definitions - reporting programs

In order to discharge its responsibilities to the community, Council has developed a set of operational and and financial objectives. These objectives have been established both on an overall basis, reflected by the City's Community Vision, and for each of its broad activities/programs.

Program name

Governance

The administration and operation of facilities and services to Elected Members of Council. This program also includes other costs that relate to the tasks of assisting elected members and ratepayers on matters which do not concern specific council services.

General purpose funding

Revenue from rates including interim rates, interest and fees on instalment arrangements and interest on arrears. This also includes amounts receivable from the Western Australian Local Government Grants Commission for untied grants such as the Financial Assistance Grants.

Law, order and public safety

Administration and operation of funds received from the Department of Fire and Emergency Services for the Bayswater SES. Provision of community safety programs and Ranger Services including animal control, parking, impounding of vehicles, fire prevention and 24/7 security services.

Health

Administration, inspection and operation of programs concerned with the general health of the community. These services include the provision of infant health centres, immunisation programs, food sampling, inspection of food premises, noise and pest control.

Education and welfare

The provision, management and support of welfare services for families, children and the aged. The activities also include the administration of senior citizens centres, youth and aged related programs.

Housing

Administration, provision and operation of housing programs for aged persons and Homeswest schemes.

Community amenities

Administration and operation of general refuse collection, sanitation and disposal services. The management of sewerage and urban stormwater drainage and the protection of environment. The provision of administration, inspection and operation of town planning and regional development services.

Recreation and culture

Administration, provision and operation of public halls, civic centres and recreation facilities. These include Morley Sport & Recreation Centre, Les Hansman Centre, Bayswater Waves, Maylands Waterland, The RISE, hire of recreation facilities, public parks, gardens and reserves maintenance. Other community programs include Avon Descent, Art Awards, Autumn River Festival, Multicultural Community Concert, Carols by Candlelight, and etc.

Transport

Construction and maintenance of roads, drainage works, footpaths, parking facilities, including the maintenance of bus shelters, cleaning of streets and the provision of street lighting.

Economic services

The regulation and/or provision of services such as tourism, area promotion and building control. It also includes place management and provision of support for local economic development.

Other property and services

Administration, inspection, and operation of work carried out on property or services not under the care, control and management of the City. These include private works, public works overheads, plant operation and other unclassified activities.

Reason for adjustments

The differences between the net current assets at the end of each financial year in the rate setting statement and net current assets detailed above arise from amounts which have been excluded when calculating the budget deficiency in accordance with Local Government (Financial Management) Regulation 32 as movements for these items have been funded within the budget estimates. These differences are disclosed as adjustments above.

Significant accounting policies

Current and non-current classification

In the determination of whether an asset or liability is current or non-current, consideration is given to the time when each asset or liability is expected to be settled. The asset or liability is classified as current if it is expected to be settled within the next 12 months, being the City of Bayswater's operational cycle. In the case of liabilities, where the City of Bayswater does not have the unconditional right to defer settlement beyond 12 months, such as vested long service leave, the liability is classified as current even if not expected to be settled within the next 12 months. Inventories held for trading are classified as current even if not expected to be realised in the next 12 months except for land held for sale where it is held as non-current based on the City of Bayswater's intentions to release for sale.

Trade and other receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from ratepayers for unpaid rates and service charges and other amounts due from third parties for goods sold and services performed in the ordinary course of business.

Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Collectability of trade and other receivables is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectible are written off when identified. An allowance for doubtful debts is raised when there is objective evidence that they will not be collectible.

2. Net current assets (continued)

Significant accounting policies (continued)

Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the City prior to the end of the financial year that are unpaid and arise when the City of Bayswater becomes obliged to make future payments in respect of the purchase of these goods and services. The amounts are unsecured, are recognised as a current liability and are normally paid within 30 days of recognition.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the City of Bayswater has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Inventories

General

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

Superannuation

The City of Bayswater contributes to a number of superannuation funds on behalf of employees.

All funds contributed by City of Bayswater are into defined contribution plans.

Employee benefits

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the City of Bayswater's obligations for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly before 12 months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries and sick leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled.

The City of Bayswater's obligations for short-term employee benefits such as wages, salaries and sick leave are recognised as a part of current trade and other payables in the statement of financial position. The City of Bayswater's obligations for employees' annual leave and long service leave entitlements are recognised as provisions in the statement of financial position.

3. Reconciliation of cash

Leases

Leases of fixed assets where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not legal ownership, are transferred to the City of Bayswater, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised, recording an asset and a liability at the lower amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of either their estimated useful lives or the lease term.

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Lease incentives under operating leases are recognised as a liability and amortised on a straight-line basis over the life of the lease term.

The City retains an equity interest with the Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) as a consequence of a contribution towards the cost of purchasing Local Government House.

The City currently holds 10 units with an estimated value of \$154,667.

Significant accounting policies

Interest in joint arrangements

Joint arrangements represent the contractual sharing of control between parties in a business venture where unanimous decisions about relevant activities are required.

Separate joint venture entities providing joint venturers with an interest to net assets are classified as a joint venture and accounted for using the equity method.

Joint venture operations represent arrangements whereby joint operators maintain direct interests in each asset and exposure to each liability of the arrangement. The City of Bayswater's interests in the assets, liabilities, revenue and expenses of joint operations are included in the respective line items of the financial statements
